In the Spring 2024 semester, the Environmental Law and Justice Clinic will be offered exclusively to JD Flex students. Up to 6 students may participate. To apply, please email this application and the listed supplemental materials to Professor Caroline Farrell cfarrell@ggu.edu and to Fe Gonzalez, fgonzalez@ggu.edu. The clinic and seminar together will amount to 4-5 units and include a 3 hour in-person class on JD flex weekends and remote asynchronous lectures. In addition to coursework, you will set a schedule for your remote clinical office hours, either 10 or 12.5 hours a week. Requirements:

- 3L in the JD Flex program and have taken evidence.
- Ability to set office hours for the semester, that are generally consistent, where you will be “in” clinic (logged on remotely.) You can set two weekly schedules – one for JD Flex weekends and one for non-JD Flex Weekends. “Shifts in clinic should be no less than 3 hours and would ideally be spread throughout the week. The hour requirement will be:
 - 10 hours a week for 13 weeks, 2 units (130 hours total.)
 - 12 hours a week for 13 weeks, 3 units (156 hours total.)
- Ability (with advanced notice and with regard for your schedule) to remotely attend client meetings, meetings with your supervisor, court hearings, or regulatory hearings outside of your regular clinic hours.
