### **MASTER OF LEGAL STUDIES**

GGU's Master in Legal Studies (MLS) degree prepares graduates for law-related careers that do not require a law license. MLS students learn to research, analyze, and apply complex legal issues to everyday business issues without the need to be a practicing attorney.

MLS students gain a foundation in law and the critical thinking skills needed to work with lawyers and legal matters in legal-adjacent professions.

The MLS program will help students determine if law school is an ideal next step in their education.
