## Environmental Law and Justice Clinic and Seminar – Get Academic Credit to Practice Social Justice Lawyering with Real Clients, No Matter Your Subject Matter Interest

At our on-campus environmental <u>clinic</u>, students work with experienced GGU law professors to represent environmental and community advocates to reduce pollution and improve public health. We've won landmark cases in the California Supreme Court and appellate courts, as well as in federal courts, enforcing clean air and water laws. The clinic's work is often covered in the <u>papers</u>.

Students are involved in all aspects of lawyering. This semester, students wrote an appellate brief in a case directed at one of the biggest water pollution challenges in the state – agriculture. Students also presented legal analysis urging regulators to control pollution from agriculture. In another case, students helped negotiate a major settlement requiring the City of Fresno and the developer of a large Amazon warehouse in a heavily impacted neighborhood to mitigate the project's impacts. In the work students do, they have multiple opportunities to rewrite and practice presentations, with significant feedback from experienced professors.
