Clinic Overview

- Seminar (twice a week) - 2 units
- Clinic – 2 or 3 units
 - WERC & ELJC
 - 2 units = 12.5 hours a week for 13 weeks (162.5 hrs total)
 - 3 units = 15 hours a week for 13 weeks (195 hrs total)
 - VLAC
 - 2 units = 10 hours a week (90 hrs total)
 - 3 units = 12 hours a week (135 hrs total)
- All three clinics will be in-person, on campus*
