LEARNING DISABILITY/ADHD DOCUMENTATION GUIDELINES

For accommodation request based on either a Learning Disability and/or AD/HD, Law Student Services must receive a cognitive-educational evaluation that is no older than 3 years. All cognitive-educational evaluations submitted to Law Disability Services will be subject to review by an independent consultant. Learning Disability Tester Qualifications:

Any evaluation must be made by an individual with one of the following qualifications:

- Masters Degree in Learning Disabilities
- Ph.D. in Learning Disabilities or
- Ph.D. in Clinical Psychology or Educational Psychology.

Law Student Services maintains a list of Bay Area evaluators used in the past by GGU students.

Tests for Learning Disability Evaluation

A clinician may choose to give a number of different tests to use to use for diagnostic purposes. GGU School of Law must receive the following test results:

Cognitive tests:

Required: WAIS – IV and/or Woodcock-Johnson III Tests of Cognitive Abilities Optional addition: Wechsler Memory Scales (most current edition)

Achievement test:

Required: Woodcock-Johnson III Tests of Achievement and/or Wechsler Individual Achievement Test (WIAT)

Optional addition: Wide Range Achievement Test (WRAT) III

The Nelson-Denny Reading Test--required

ADHD Tester Qualifications:

For accommodations on the basis of ADHD, a note from a medical professional alone will not constitute sufficient documentation. A full cognitive-educational evaluation as described above is required. The testing may be done by an evaluator with a Masters degree, but a diagnosis of ADHD may only be made by a specialist with a PhD, MD, or equivalent doctorate degree, such as a psychologist or behavioral doctor.

Tests for ADHD Evaluation

An evaluation for ADHD must include the above tests required for a Learning Disability evaluation *along with* at least two of the following additional tests for ADHD:

Connors' Adult ADHD Rating Scales (CAARS) Conners' Adult ADHD Diagnostic Interview for DSM-IV (CAADID) Brown ADD Scales (for Adolescents and Adults) Stroop Color and Word Test California Verbal Learning Test
